A standalone unit from any study area.

Mandatory Literacy and Numeracy Test

Students are responsible for arranging and successfully completing the national Literacy and Numeracy Test for Initial **Teacher Education Students** through the Australian Council for education Research prior to completing 200 credit points of study.

A Working With Children Check

All students must maintain a current Working with Children Check (from the appropriate State Authority) throughout the duration of the program.

Police Check

Students must maintain a current police check throughout the duration of the program.
